In this interactive workshop, Penny will offer a perspective on what antisemitism is and what it is not, weaving in her personal journey as well.

The workshop will explore how antisemitism functions, who this serves, how it's being weaponized, and how it's showing up on the Right (dangerous), also on the Left – plus its connection to white nationalism, white supremacy, and Islamophobia.

Penny is a life-long heartfelt rabble-rouser. A founding board member of Jewish Voice for Peace, she is former Jewish Caucus Chair of the National Women's Studies Association and is a member of the European American Collaborative for Challenging Whiteness. Penny teaches at City College of San Francisco and is active on the Sanctuary and Racial Justice Committees of Kehilla Synagogue in Oakland, CA. Her most recent book, *Hope into Practice: Jewish women choosing justice despite our fears*, is an activist's call to heal the world!
